He doesn't have a home church near where he lives. Nathan did tell me the place he felt most welcomed was in South Korea. That service was not in English, but he still felt welcome.

Let's make a New Years resolution to make every person who enters Emanuel Lutheran Church doors feel welcome, let's make everyone want to come back. This doesn't need to be a committee, each one of us can become a part of welcoming others. Who knows... maybe you will greet an angel.

COUNCIL UPDATE

- Council met on 12/21/22 via Zoom.
- Pastor Jennifer met with Bishop Miller, as he meets with all Ecumenical Partners.
- The Executive Committee approved the renewal of the contract with Pastor Jennifer as well as the remuneration package for all staff members.
- Budgeted Income for November is \$818.95 less than Budgeted Expenses. Budgeted Income YTD is \$6,013.90 more than Budgeted Expenses.
- Shrove Tuesday: The Corning Area Clergy request Emanuel to host the event on 2/21/23. Our MiM have organized the event in the past. The hope is to alternate again with UCC.
- Jazz Sunday will be on 2/19 at Christ Episcopal Church.
- Lenten Dinners: to resume
- Budget: Carrie presented and explained the budget, drafted by the Treasurer and adapted by the Executive Committee during their zoom meeting on 12/19/22. A few additional changes were recommended and discussed, and some were accepted.
- Fellowship Hall Roof: As our insurance requires a replacement due to its age of 30 years, a quote was obtained. The amount is \$22,500 and can most likely be covered when we re-appropriate some funds in the Savings Account, e.g., Youth Group, Weight Watchers, Building Use, Capital Campaign, Project's Fund and some donations to the Memorial Fund. In the process we can close some funds, as they have met their purpose.
- Format of the Annual Meeting: We will have a hybrid approach and will encourage in-person attendance. Carrie and Annette will co-lead the meeting, with Annette facilitating communication with the virtual attenders. Ballots can only be accepted from voting members who have attended either in person or virtually.

At WELCA's October meeting, it was decided that we would collect items and assemble "personal care kits" to send to Lutheran World Relief. There are so many people in this country and all over the world, who are in desperate situations. Our projected date for collecting and assembling the kits is January, 2023. Stay tuned for future details!

EACH PERSONAL CARE KIT INCLUDES:

ONE light-weight bath-size towel (between 20" x 40" and 52" x 27"), dark color recommended

TWO or three bath-size bars of soap equaling 8 to 9 oz., any brand, in original wrapping

ONE adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging* ONE sturdy comb, remove packaging

ONE metal nail clippers (attached file optional), remove packaging

* Be sure to shop for light- or medium-weight towels, which are easier for Kit recipients to hand wash and air dry, take up less storage space and are considerably less expensive than the fluffier towels we may prefer to use.

- Bath towels vary in size. The 52" X 27" size listed in the guidelines is the maximum size. 20" x 40" Is a good guideline for a minimum size.
- Please give new items only.

- Please do not donate items with any religious symbols, messages or your group's name.
- Please do not donate any items decorated with a U.S. flag, patriotic or military symbols, or references to the armed forces, including camouflage.
- Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed.
- All items should be new and in good condition. Do not enclose the Kit or any of its contents in plastic bags.



Reconciling in Christ Training:

Building an Inclusive Church (BIC) training helps you design and implement a journey for your faith community to publicly and intentionally welcome people of all sexual orientations, gender identities, and gender expressions, and incorporate a commitment to the work of racial equity. Building an Inclusive Church helps you explore your own Christian call to hospitality and evangelism and equips you with ways to create dialogue, deepening relationships throughout your faith community rather than sparking debate and division. The Building an Inclusive Church (BIC) Toolkit and BIC Training are resources, to be used side by side in your journey of welcome. The training itself is designed to expand on the tools in the BIC Toolkit to best support the team of leaders who hope to guide your faith community. The training is 4.5 hours long, and held online through Zoom in real-time; registration is \$75 per person. 2023 Trainings: January 7, February 4, March 4, May 6, June 3 BIC trainings will take place from 11:00 AM - 3:30 PM CT. Registration will close at 12:00 PM CT the Thursday prior to the training. Zoom links and training details will be emailed once registration

closes.
