Liminal Spaces

Come this time of year, I often think of liminal spaces. The word liminal comes from the Latin word "limen," (knew that high school Latin would be useful for something...) which means threshold. A google search suggests that "to be in a liminal space means to be on the precipice of something new, but not quite there yet... being in a liminal space can be incredibly uncomfortable."

I see a lot of liminal spaces... Moses and the Israelites stood in a liminal space, an in-between place, on the threshold of the promised land, for 40 years. Pandemic was full of liminal spaces, changing with each shift in numbers and new variant. Christians stand in a liminal space during this time of 'between' Lent and Easter. I have found it both important and useful to notice the liminal space and think about how I want to enter into it.

I see the church in a liminal place... both the church universal, and this particular church called Emanuel... as well. Maybe it is a way (useful or important) to think about the current place we stand as a congregation, and think through how it invites us to cross the threshold and move forward.

What thoughts do you have about the place we stand as a congregation? When have you experienced liminal spaces? What does this look like? I'd be curious to hear if you're willing share... maybe over coffee?

According to "Mouse Prints Journey Through the Church Year", from AAL: The Easter season begins on Easter Sunday with the celebration of the resurrection of our Lord and lasts for 50 days. The date of Easter changes from year to year. It occurs on the first Sunday after the first full moon following the spring equinox.





### **Emanuel Lutheran Church Council Update**


- Council met on 3/15/23 via Zoom.
- Pastor Jennifer reports that the funeral for Evar Overstrom (Family member of founders of ELC) will be on 3/17, and for Bonnie Johnson 4/11.
- Pastor Jennifer will be off for the week of 5/21/23.
- YTD Budget Income is \$780.11 less than YTD Budget Expenses.
- Update on roof: The quote of Hillside Builders was chosen from the 4 quotes received. They will start between April and mid-May. The Insurance Company was informed. The gutters will not be replaced but re-installed by the contractor. The 5 existing roof vents will be replaced by a ridge vent. There is a possibility of a spring fundraiser to replenish the funds used up by the roof project.
- Discussion on each council member representing a committee/team/ministry: All council members should talk to the teams they belong to about the best process to update council. To be discussed again next month.
- Continuing resolution review: Some sections were approved, others will be discussed again next month.
- Renewal of Casella contract: Phyllis Brandes informed Sharon that the contract is up for renewal, with no increase in fees. It was decided that Phyllis should renew the contract and be the contact person, seconded by Annette, all in favor. Passed.
- Minutes from the Stewardship Meeting on 3/5/23 were emailed on 3/13/23.
- The Property Team is looking into the possibility of putting a sink in the altar guild room. The FH paper towel dispensers need to be replaced. The fridge in the altar guild room needs to be repositioned. The problems with the Honeywell thermostat in the FH were addressed. The timer on the Narthex air purifier and the schedule on the church thermostat need attention. Lew provided some historic documents and the abstract for the parking lot purchase.

# Overview

The attack on Pearl Harbor changes everything for Lana Hitchcock. 
