

Jesus taught about God's presence—not in places special or far away—but in the "usual" places. When stilling a storm, he and the disciples are in an ordinary boat, not unlike what they had once fished from before answering Jesus' call. Stilling the storm was remarkable, but the place where it was stilled from? Not so much. Jesus regularly used farming metaphors to teach—farming was a customary work for those to whom he spoke. Or even using bread to describe what the kingdom of heaven was like... in all these examples I am reminded by Jesus that God is present and living in the ordinary moments we might miss or take for granted.

Sometimes, God is there, right and front of me, ready to be seen face to face, if I am open to see.

As fall activities resume, whatever they are: school, meetings, clubs, a certain pace at work, etc., I invite you to look for God in those ordinary places in your routine. Or if this is already something you do well, look for God in another place, an unexpected place. I would love to hear about what you find... see you soon.

Emanuel Lutheran Church Council Update

- Council met on 7/12/23 in person.
- Pastor Jennifer reports that there is one youth ready to start confirmation classes. Pastor Jennifer wants him to have opportunities to connect with congregation members, by members participating in presenting classes. Council members suggested possible collaboration with other denominations, for peer support for the confirmand, and because of the limited time of our half-time pastor and the busy schedules of our church volunteers.
- YTD Budget Income is \$452.97 less than YTD Budget Expense.
- Twitter update: We have 4 followers. Sharon is posting the Sunday sermon, Bible verses and our Mission Statement.
- AED update: it was purchased in 2014 and lasts about 8-15 years. It has not been properly maintained; thus for now a sign has been placed on the container that it is not to be used. Sharon, Brenda and Caren will form a Memorial Team to discuss how we should move forward, and how to handle memorials in the future. Phyllis Groeger will be invited to join the team, as she oversees Memorials, and whoever else wishes to join.
- RIC: Because Bill is not leading his regular Bible Study on 9/12 at noon, we will provide during that time an opportunity for people to ask questions. On 10/15 we will have a discussion with the theme "A place within our Walls', as our plans for inclusion go deeper than just LGBTQ+ people. We will discuss a Welcome Statement.
- Outreach: For our 'God's Work our Hands' Day on 9/10 we will wear our yellow T-shirts to church.
- Stewardship: At the meeting on 7/9 it was decided to have a Mission Moment as part of the Reflections during worship on 8/20. .
- Property: The ladies' room dripping sink was fixed by Mike T. Augie and Tom continue to perform chores around the church. Mike T. power washed the sidewalk between the church and fellowship hall, as well as the wooden steps out of the Acolyte room, and Brenda stained the steps. The wooden sign at the front is being refinished. The handrails in the church were tightened, the toilet in the basement was stabilized and the dehumidifier was fixed. Three electrical issues are receiving attention. Corning Natural Gas Company was contacted about upcoming gas line replacements. The team meets on 8/20.

Why I chose to volunteer at Habitat for Humanity.

As I come from a long family history of home builders, masons, and contractors, I've always had a love and fascination for the craftsmanship of people who build beautiful things from a pile of lumber, or a stack of bricks and a bag of concrete. Over the many years, I've tried my own hands at building things for family, friends and ourselves — with variable levels of success. Although I chose a different career path than my father and grandfather, I've also always wanted to volunteer at Habitat for Humanity to apply some of my modest skills, and learn new ones, at that worthy cause. Prior to our retirement from work, we really didn't have the time available to make meaningful commitments to this worthy cause; however, now in retirement, we have much more flexibility in how we spend our days.

In May, Emanuel Lutheran sponsored a volunteer day at Habitat for Humanity on William Street in Corning. Sharon and I joined the Emanuel team as we spent about 5 hours performing painting, demolition, and landscaping duties at this old house on Williams Street. We were hooked.

Since then, Sharon and I have volunteered regularly at Habitat, almost exclusively at Hornby Road in Corning, where a small, brand-new duplex is under construction for two families of partially disabled US Veterans. We usually work two full days per week, as part of the larger build crew, doing everything from: installing drywall; taping, mudding and sanding the joints; plumbing; electrical; to vinyl siding installation; etc.

While it's hard work, it's also a fun way to spend time with like-minded individuals, all working to provide affordable, safe housing for deserving people less fortunate than ourselves. We've met the future owners of the properties, and uniformly they are very appreciative of the efforts of Habitat and the volunteers, some of whom have been volunteering for 15-25 years; and we're happy to help them in some small way. Following the devastating recent fire at the Habitat ReStore, which left their income generating building destroyed, helping to build new housing for deserving families is more important than ever. We expect to continue volunteering with Habitat until we are physically no longer able to do so.


