

#### Church Council Update

Emanuel Lutheran Church Council Meeting Update, September 17, 2025

August Budget Income: \$4,762.38 YTD Budget Income: \$56,491.29 August Budget Expense: \$5.877.73 YTD Budget Expense: \$45,126.00 Loss: \$1,115.35 Gain: \$11,365.29

- Bylaws are finalized. They will be emailed to the congregation. Sharon has merged the constitution and bylaws into a new document.
- Finance Team will meet in October to evaluate the 3rd quarter numbers.
- Property Team provided a planned list of projects with projected costs, which were discussed. The possible need for replacing the furnace is a concern.
- God's Work our Hands: 50 bags of personal care kits were assembled on 9/7. The Corning Community Food Pantry volunteers were very grateful when Caren delivered the bags on 9/17. Brenda will choose some items from the leftover items for the Blessing Box, and Sharon will take the rest to the CCFP together with her monthly deliveries of donations from ELC.
- Worship and Music Team met on 9/14 to discuss liturgical settings and plan future events. A planning retreat is scheduled for 10/18 to allow more time for discussions.
- Technology: Brenda spent \$100 on a microphone for streaming the Hope and Healing Service from the FH. To bring the website PHP up to date she needs the help of a consultant, who needs to be paid.
- Hospitality: As we don't have a team currently, Brenda discussed her idea with WELCA that different people should sign up to be responsible for coordinating refreshments for different occasions.
- Altar Guild: more volunteers are urgently needed.
- Cooperation with other Lutheran Churches: When we meet with them on 10/5 Brenda will suggest that we volunteer together at the Food Bank.

#### From the Council Vice President:

Constitution, Bylaws, Continuing Resolutions.. Oh no!

Oh yes. That time of year is coming again. The annual meeting is approaching and your church council, especially president Sharon, has been working hard to get documents ready.

Last year we had the first of two consecutive votes on the updated constitution. We will be voting on that update again at our upcoming meeting.

The constitution is the governing document that gives guidance and clarity on how Emanuel Lutheran operates. It is based on the Model Constitution for congregations of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.

The bylaws give the details of operational rules. For example it may define the purpose of committees. The last time the by-laws were updated was in 2005. That edition is very outdated and the reference numbers needed to be corrected. The church council has been working to get the bylaws ready for the congregational vote (bylaws only need to be voted on one year). The proposed updates are numbered to coincide with the constitution item they define. The bylaws may not contradict nor should they repeat the constitution.

For example the constitution says:

C10.01 The congregation shall have at least one regular meeting per year. The regular meeting(s) of the congregation shall be held at the time(s) specified in the bylaws. Consistent with the laws of the State of New York, the bylaws shall designate one regular meeting per year as the annual meeting of this congregation.

The proposed bylaw is: C10.01.01 The annual congregational meeting will be held on the last Sunday in the month of January.

The continuing resolutions can be used to describe the day-to-day operating procedures such as the role of each officer. These will not need to be voted on by the congregation.



#### **Corning Trees**

After learning about a group called Corning Trees, a group trying to restore the tree population in Corning, we decided to contact them. Brenda emailed, and some brief highlights from their emails are below:

From Brenda: "In 2016, the city was concerned about four maple trees surrounding our church and removed them. A few new trees were planted, but they're in front of our Fellowship Hall. Summer worship is hotter without their shade, and we've seen the results of the loss of tree protection to our original wooden sign, front doors, lights, etc.

#### From Corning Trees:

We love these before/after photos, thanks for sharing! I wish folks could see the differences more often. Humans intrinsically seek out shaded streets and it's so much better for us, our buildings, and our other-than-human neighbors when we live under a tree canopy. May we use these pictures to show our virtual audience? I have you on our list and we will be in touch soon to let you know how many we can afford to plant this season!

As far as the stumps or roots of the old trees go, we will bring a saw and cut them away as needed. The new trees will happily grow around them and they will add nutrients to the soil as they decompose. We have our order in. We'll

be ordering your trees this week! I'll let you know when the planting week will be and we can coordinate to have your folks participate if they want!

I would like to plant four native varieties of trees around the main building... two on Williams and two on Woodlawn Ave. Because there are no power lines to speak of, we can plant large trees that will really help with the biodiversity of the neighborhood! I'm hoping for two oaks and two maples. But it will depend on the availability from our nursery. The maples are \$125/per and the oaks are \$134/per so the total for those four will be \$518. Any financial contribution your church can make would be so helpful! We are still learning how to fundraise, so most of our tree purchases are just crowdsourced amongst our small crew.

A donation link for the Corning Tree Project at the Community Foundation was included with their email. But it'll be easier if you write a check to Emanuel Lutheran Church with Corning Tree Project on the subject line, and we'll send one check from our church. We'll keep you up-to-date on the planting date for those who'd like to participate. Any questions or concerns, please speak to Brenda Passmore.


MISSION .. engage in the Synod Call Process to help identify possible candidate(s) for our open part-time Pastor position at Emanuel.
