


Church Council Update

Emanuel Lutheran Church Council Meeting Update, November 19, 2025

October Budget Income: \$6,649.78 YTD Budget Income: \$68,704.53 October Budget Expense: \$6,795.61 YTD Budget Expense: \$58,038.38

October Loss: \$ 145.83 YTD Gain: \$10,666.15

- Dean Jason reports that the pulpit supply schedule for the next 3 months has only 1 opening per month.
- At the Southern Tier Fall Conference on 10/26 the redistricting of the Southern Tier was approved. The 3 congregations in our area will join the Genesee Finger Lakes Conference. This will come into effect if approved by the Synod Assembly June 2026. We can continue to use the current SAMs for pulpit supply.
- Dean Jason spoke to Gisela, the leader of our current Call committee. She will receive more paperwork from Rachel Sosebee, the Synod Mobility Specialist.
- Bethany Lutheran will listen to and meet a candidate approved by their call committee on 12/7. This candidate had indicated willingness to engage with the 2 nearby congregations.
- Budget update: Due to increased costs the estimated budget expenses for 2026 are \$91,006, but currently only \$76,040 have been pledged, resulting in a deficit of \$14,966, which may need to be taken from Investments.
- Council supports that the congregation will contribute to the SAM education for Annette.
- 2025 model constitution: changes to our current constitution were discussed. Our amended constitution will be emailed to Pastor L Chilton for approval before submitting it to the congregation.
- Brenda reports that she has moved her hours working as Administrative Assistant from Thursday afternoon to Wednesday afternoon.
- Prior to the meeting Jim emailed an updated task list for the Property Team.

Have you invited that person walking their dog to join us for Sunday Church services?

There are many family members we need to get to know.


As a result, Thrivent donated \$500 directly to the Corning Community Food Pantry. Thank you to all who donated, but especially the Groegers for facilitating it!

Thank you to everyone who joined us for the Fall Clean-Up on Saturday, November 1st. Many hands did make the work go quickly.



Our Constitution and Bylaws:

Our synod updated their model constitution this summer to the 2025 model constitution. This required that we update our Emanuel Lutheran Constitution. You should have received the combined 2025 model AND the new bylaws in an email from the office. The bylaws are embedded in the model constitution. You can recognize the bylaws by the additional set of numbers, and that they are in a different font. There is a printed copy available in the green binder in the Narthex if you don't receive email or would like to look at a printed copy. You may borrow it, but please return it promptly so others may read it.

The constitution requires a vote for two successive years. The first vote will be in January 2026. The bylaws require just one vote, which will be in January 2026.


